IDAHO---Open-market trading by processors with growers was inactive. Contract negotiations continue between growers and dehydration plants. According to the latest NASS Potato Stocks report issued March 14, 2011, processors in Idaho and Malheur County Oregon used 6.54 million cwt of 2010 crop raw potatoes during February, down 4.9 percent from February 2010. Processors in Idaho and Malheur County, Oregon have used 39.2 million cwt of

2010 crop raw potatoes to March 1, down 6.7 percent from last year. Idaho potatoes accounted for 34.3 million cwt of the total processed. Potato stocks held by growers, dealers, and processors in Idaho on March 1 totaled 54.5 million cwt, 13.0 million cwt less than on hand March 1, 2010. This is the lowest March 1 stocks level since 1989. Stocks in the 10 Southwest counties totaled 2.10 million cwt, down from last years 2.70 million cwt. The Other counties stocks, at 52.4 million cwt, were down from the 64.8 million cwt stored on March 1, 2010.

COLUMBIA BASIN, WASHINGTON---According to the latest NASS Potato Stocks report issued March 14, 2011, processors in Washington and Oregon (excluding Malheur County) used 46.7 million cwt of raw potatoes to March 1, 2011, 2.9 million cwt more than the 43.8 million cwt processed during the same period last year, but 3.2 million cwt less than the 49.9 million cwt processed during the same time two years ago. Processing to March 1, 2011 in the Pacific Northwest accounted for 40 percent of the 2010 production. Potatoes stored in Washington on March 1, 23011 were estimated at 25.7 million cwt, 9.2 million cwt less than the 34.9 million cwt in storage on March 1, 2010 and 5.7 million less than the 31.4 million cwt in storage on March 1, 2009.
