Unless otherwise stated, shipments, crossings or imports are for the weeks ending April 9, 16 and April 23, 2011, in that order in thousand hundredweight (cwt) or 100,000 pound units. Expected movement is for the period April 24-May 7, 2011. Prices are for Monday, April 25, 2011 compared with Monday, April 18, 2011. Unless otherwise stated, sales are F.O.B. Shipping Point Basis (including Delivered Sales, F.O.B. Shipping Point Basis) or port of entry and extra services are included. Prices represent open (spot) market sales by first handlers on product of generally good quality and condition unless otherwise stated and may include promotional allowances or other incentives. No consideration is given to after-sale adjustments unless otherwise stated. Brokerage fees paid by shipper are included in the price reported.

In the north part of New York it has varied from 22 to 58. In west and central New York it has varied from 50 to 106. And in the southern part of New York it has varied from 60 to 141. Soil temperatures continue to be on the cool side and vary from 36 to 42 degrees at a 4 inch depth.

APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD-PA-VA-WV)---Shipments 15-12-14 (Export 0-1-0)---Movement expected to decrease as most shippers have finished for the season. A couple of shippers expect to continue with light shipments for several more weeks. **LAST REPORT.**

MICHIGAN---Shipments 16-15-10---Movement expected to continue seasonal decline as many growers are finished for the season. Trading fairly slow. Prices generally unchanged. Cartons 12 3-pound film bags U.S.Extra Fancy 2 1/2 inch minimum Red Delicious 17.00-20.00, Golden Delicious mostly 17.00-18.00, and Law Rome mostly 14.50-16.00. Remaining supplies very light and in few hands. Light shipments expected next 2-3 weeks. 2011 CROP UPDATE: Continued cool and wet weather has continued slowing bud and blossom development. According to Michigan State University Extension agents, there has been no loss to Spring freeze injury as yet. There is a pronounced variation in north to south crop developmet with southern areas a week or more ahead of northern areas. There is also a lesser variation from east to west with areas away from Lake Michigan more advanced. Growers busy applying apple scab sprays and copper to ward off fire blight. **LAST REPORT.**

No New England apples were traded on the Boston wholesale market Monday, April 25, 2011. 2011 CROP UPDATE: Growing degree days, since January 1, 2011 for the 2011 season has varied across the apple growing areas of New England. POTATOES FOR PROCESSING

UNITED STATES---According to NASS, processors in the 9 major States have used 127 million cwt of 2010 storage-crop potatoes this season, up 2 percent from the same period last year. Dehydrating usage accounted for 19.5 million cwt of the total processing, down 16 percent from last year.
