Fuel prices continue to trend higher with the average in California now registering \$4.47. Freight rates are firm with sharp increases expected as we move toward summer, with strong seasonal demand for transportation for tree fruit, grapes and melons.

Mid-week temperatures have been unseasonably well above average under clear skies, approaching records in various California growing areas. #### **Mixed Vegetables**

**Carrots:** We are continuing see moderate relief to the shortage. Selected shippers are now able to fill orders in full for cello and table-sized carrots. The shortage on jumbo carrots (and the processed carrots that are made from jumbos) will continue through May, with June 1<sup>st</sup> the latest estimate for improved availability. Prices are extreme, quality good.

Asparagus: Price levels have peaked as production begins to increase in Washington State. Prices are *extreme*, quality *excellent*.

Artichokes: Spring harvest winding down earlier than usual, with no increase in availability for the large sizes (18s & 24s) until late May. Prices are low to moderate, quality good.

**Cauliflower:** Plentiful supplies. Prices are low, quality excellent.

**Celery:** Upward price pressure continues due to low yields caused by seeders and decreased lost acreage due to heavy winter rainfall. Large sizes are in tightest supply (18s & 24s). Prices are high, quality fair.

**Green Onions**: Good supplies. Prices are *low*, quality good.

**Parsley** (curly): Supplies are adequate. Prices moderate, quality good.

**Parsley** (Italian): Continued tight availability. Prices are *extreme*, quality fair.

**Spinach** (bunched): Good supplies. Prices moderate, quality good. **Kale** (green): Good supplies. Prices moderate, quality good.

Kale (flowering): Steady availability. Prices moderate, quality good.

**Cilantro:** Plentiful availability for most shippers, market has eased. Prices are *low*, quality good.

Leeks: Continued tight supplies. Demand is strong from Canadian receivers. Because this is a long-maturing crop, the effects of increased planted acreage are not realized for up to six months. Prices are extreme, quality good.

**Green Cabbage**: Good availability in California, Florida and Texas. Prices moderate, quality good.

**Red Cabbage**: Availability has tightened considerably. Prices are *high*, quality good.

**Bok Choy:** Increasing production in coastal districts of California, prices are moderate, quality good.

**Napa**: Light supplies. Prices are high, quality good.

**Snow peas**: Good availability from California. Prices moderate, quality good.

**Garlic:** Tight supplies, *high* prices. Imports are reduced and quality is poor from China. No relief until late summer, when new crop California garlic will be available.

**Spring Mix:** Good supplies, quality improving. Prices moderate, quality good.

**Spinach** (baby): Good supplies. Prices moderate, quality good.

**Honeydews:** Production in Mexico is coming on strong. Supplies are plentiful. Offshore product from Central America is still available. Prices are *low*, quality good.

Watermelons: Plentiful availability for seedless and seeded watermelon in Nogales, continuing well into May. Prices are low, quality excellent.

**Red Delicious:** Strong demand continues for storage crop apples. Yields are high, with little shrink during packing runs. Prices moderate, quality good.

**Golden Delicious**: Increasing supply, prices moderate.

**Lemons:** Availability is adequate for all sizes, larger sizes in the San Joaquin Valley and smaller sizes in Ventura County. Looking ahead, the desert fall crop will be smaller than average due to the cold winter we have experienced in 2010-2011, same also for the Navel crop for 2011-2012. Lemon prices moderate to high, quality good.

Limes (Persian): Prices have eased once again, and the small sizes offer the best value
