# POTATOES FOR PROCESSING

**UNITED STATES**---According to NASS, processors in the 9 major States have used 161 million cwt of potatoes this season, up 1 percent from the same period last year. Dehydrating usage accounted for 25.8 million of the total processing, down 14 percent from last year. **IDAHO**---Open-market trading by processors with growers was moderate. Open-market prices paid to growers for Russet Burbank potatoes, Storage- run, bulk, per cwt, less dirt, rot and green tare, F.O.B. growers storage unless otherwise stated: French-Fry quality 12.00. According to NASS, processors in Idaho and Malheur County, Oregon used 6.57 million cwt of 2010 crop raw potatoes during May, down 3.8 percent from May 2010. Processors in Idaho and Malheur County, Oregon have used 59.4 million cwt of 2010 crop raw potatoes to June 1, down 5.7 percent from last year. Idaho potatoes accounted for 51.8 million cwt of the total processed. The remaining 7.52 million cwt were produced in other states.

**FLORIDA**---Shipments to Chippers 381-328-298---Movement expected to decrease seasonally. Too few open market sales to establish a market.

**ELIZABETH CITY DISTRICT, NORTH CAROLINA**---Shipments to Chippers 0-1-51 ---Movement expected to increase. Currently, no F.O.B. being reported.

**EASTERN SHORE OF VIRGINIA**---The initial harvest of chipstock potatoes is expected to begin during the week of June 19 although most growers will not start until the week of June 26.
