**National Egg Review** 

This week New York prices are higher for extra-large and large, steady for medium. Regional prices increased on all sizes early in the week. Next week's regional asking prices are trending slightly higher for large, steady to slightly higher for medium, and steady for the balance. The undertone is steady. Retail demand ranges light to good, mostly moderate to fairly good. Food service demand remains light to moderate. Offerings are light to moderate for the larger sizes and mostly moderate for mediums. Market activity is moderate. Breaking stock prices are steady with a steady undertone. Demand is light to instances moderate. Offerings are light.

Supplies are light to moderate. Market activity is slow. North Central regional light type hen removal costs are steady. Demand is moderate to fairly good with offerings light. Schedules are full-time. Market activity is moderate.

# WEEKLY FRYERS AVAILABLE FOR MARKETING

Based on the preliminary chick placements, the number of fryers available for marketing during the week ending 06-Aug-11 is estimated at 156.2 million head. This compares to 157.1 million head the previous week and to 164.7 million head the same week a year ago, when the slaughter was 168.6 million head and the composite weighted average price was 82.14 cents per pound.
