## CRANBERRIES

ALL PRODUCTION AREAS ---- Initial harvest expected to get underway in Massachusetts and Wisconsin current week, while Washington expected to begin late in the period. Production for 2011 expected to be up 10 percent from 2010, according to the National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS). Nearly 7.5 million barrels (100 pounds per barrel) of cranberries are expected to be shipped for 2011, which would be the second-biggest shipments on record, released by NASS in the August Cranberry Forecast. Wisconsin is slated to ship 4.3 million barrels, an increase of 9 percent over last season (3.9 barrels), Massachusetts 2.1 million barrels, up 11 percent (1.9 barrels) and Washington 173,000 barrels, up sharply by 60 percent over last season (108,000 barrels). Initially, the season was running about 3 weeks behind schedule, but lots of heat and sunshine in July helped move the season back to close to normal start. Both Wisconsin and Massachusetts attribute the bumper crop to plenty of summer moisture and heat. FIRST REPORT.
