
Beef, Veal and Lamb Report

Beef, Veal & Lamb- Beef output last week fell 3.5% and was 2.1% less than a year ago. The Jan 1st cattle on feed inventory was 3% bigger than last year. Cattle placements into feedlots in Dec were 6% less than '11 and the average cattle weight was down 1%. The Feb 1st near slaughter ready cattle inventory is estimated to be 6% more than the 3 year average. Yet, beef output is expected to trend below '11 levels during all of Q1which could support beef prices. If existing elevated beef prices remain in place over the next few weeks, any seasonal Feb price appreciation that occurs for beef could be tempered.



Oil and Grains Report


Oil & Grains- The South American corn and soybean crops have been hindered by weather challenges. This may continue to support the US corn and soybean markets if longstanding.


Dairy Report

Dairy- US milk production in Dec was 2.5% more than the prior year due to a 1.6% gain in the milk per cow yield and a .9% larger milk cow herd. Given the recent declines in cheese and butter prices milk farmers could temper milk output growth in the coming months. The US cheese inventory build rate in Dec was the 2nd biggest for that month since '05. Since '07, the average price move for cheese blocks over the next 4 weeks is 5.6% higher. The US butter stock build in Dec was historically high as well. Still, a seasonal price bottom is expected for cheese and butter soon.



Pork Report

Pork- Pork production last week rose .8% and was 2.4% larger than the same week in '11. Pork output should begin to seasonally decline in the coming weeks which usually supports pork prices. Cold storage pork inventories on Dec 31st were smaller than last year for hams (19%), bellies (19%) and ribs (10%). Some modest ham price appreciation may be pending. Since '07, the average price move for hams in Feb is 5.8% higher.




Canned Tomato Report

Tomato Products, Canned- Existing canned tomato supplies are adequate but are below '11 levels. The canned tomato markets could remain firm.

Poultry Report


Poultry- The Dec broiler (chicken marked for the chicken meat supply) chick hatch was 3% smaller than last year suggesting that chicken output should trend below '11 levels in the coming weeks. Dec pullet placements into the broiler breeding flock were 3.7% less than the prior year. The breeding flock is projected to fall 4% below year ago levels by this summer which should provide further support to chicken prices. The chicken wing markets established new record highs recently and higher wing prices are still likely in the coming weeks. However, some price relief for chicken wings is due to occur in late Feb. The chicken leg quarter and the boneless skinless chicken breast markets remain firm.

Seafood Report

Seafood- In '11, total US Gulf of Mexico shrimp landings were up 23% from '10 and the largest since '09. US Gulf of Mexico shrimp landings during Dec were 37% less than the prior year's abnormally large total. Shrimpers are facing high fuel costs which may slow fishing schedules. Still, the future value of the US dollar will probably play the biggest role in influencing US shrimp prices. Snow crab prices are relatively steady.



Produce Report

Produce- The lettuce harvest was limited last week with shipments declining 25% from the prior week. This was due in large part to below freezing overnight temperatures in the growing areas. But, favorable weather during the next 10 days should enhance crop development. Lettuce prices are higher but still 41% below their 3 year average for the week. Tomato supplies are in good shape which is pressuring the tomato markets lower. Still, the downside risk from here for tomatoes is nominal. The yellow onion market is trading at its lowest level in recent memory.
