Landings of inshore or Gulf of Maine cod, already cut by 22% for the 2012 fishing year that ends Apr. 30, could be further reduced by between 76.8% and 82.6% starting in May and covering the next three years, according to the NOAA's New England Regional Fishery Management Council. Landings of offshore, or Georges Bank, cod were also projected to be reduced by 60% for the 2013 fishing year that begins May 1, reported *Gloucester Times*. Full Story
