Buyers continue to buy hand to mouth keeping floor stocks balanced to short. Market activity is slow to mostly moderate. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week business. Prices are trending firm for whole breast; steady to firm for b/s breast, weak to lower for wings and steady to weak for the balance of items. Tenders are noted as available. Offerings of breast cuts, drums and thighs are light to moderate and clearing well; wings are weak with discounted noted. Tenders are moderate to heavy. Market activity is slow to moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed, but mostly desirable.
