Market News

NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

Whole broiler/fryer prices are trending steady overall. Offerings are light to available for current trade needs. Retail and food service demand is light to moderate with many anticipating good movement for first of the month business. Floor stocks are light to moderate. Market activity is slow to moderate. Some were noting issues with trucking availability for late week deliveries in parts of the West. In the parts structure, movement is mostly light entering the Easter holiday weekend. Prices are trending weak to lower for wings, steady to firm for dark meat items and breast cut, steady for the balance of parts. Offerings of breast cuts and tenders are light and clearing well; dark meat items are light to moderate and wings are available and competitively priced. Market activity for parts is seasonally slow to moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mixed but mostly desirable weights.

Broiler-fryer slaughter under federal inspection for 29-Mar-13 and 30-Mar-13 is estimated to be 27,852,000 head down 9.35 percent from a week ago and down 11.61 percent from a year ago. (Last week 30,726,000, last year 31,512,000)

Weekly broiler-fryer slaughter under federal inspection for the week ending 30-Mar-13 is estimated to be 149,997,000 head down 2.69 percent from a week ago, and up 0.16 percent from a year ago.

LIVE SPENT HEAVY FOWL

Prices are trending steady. Supplies are sufficient for the moderate demand. Processing schedules are mostly normal with some down time due to the Religious holiday weekend. Retail feature activity is moderate to good entering the weekend with majority of interest being in the Southeast and South Central regions. Finished product supplies are moderate and clearing well. Market activity is moderate.

Prices are trending steady for the seasonally light to moderate demand. Offerings of light type hens are sufficient for current needs. Processing schedules are mostly normal. Movement of finished product sales are clearing well. Market activity is moderate. The majority price for removal costs is unchanged at 0-7 cents per head.
