
#### **Market Commentary**

Commentary: As I have written, if wet weather persisted being wet, farmers would switch to corn. Thankfully, and proof by last week's corn futures, farmers had a window to get some planting done. Temperatures in several areas warmed up to break records, and it dried up enough to allow some planting to get done. In fact farmers were feverishly planting last week. Modern farming technology helped them make tremendous strides and this week's crop report should shed some light on how much they got done. There are still some concerns. The early, very hot weather does cause worry for corn especially. If the weather gets too hot too fast it can keep corn from pollenating, effectively reducing yield. It is way too early to be concerned about that from a reality standpoint, but traders will concern themselves with it to help them move the market in a favorable direction. Some increases were seen in the soybean complex, but it is still in a very tight range and volatility is measured very low. Wheat is on the decline. There seems to be no issues with wheat currently. Winter wheat harvest is about to begin.


Corn futures closed between \$6.41-1/2 and \$7.18 per bushel, ending the week at \$6.52-3/4. Soybean futures closed between \$14.12-3/4 and \$15.21 per bushel, ending the week at \$14.48-1/2. Soybean meal futures closed between \$410.50 and \$461.00 per short ton, ending the week at \$425.10. Soybean oil futures closed between \$0.4926 and \$0.4961 per pound, ending the week at \$0.4952. Wheat futures closed between \$6.83-1/4 and \$7.10-3/4 per bushel, ending the week at \$6.83-1/4.







### Soybeans - CBOT Weekly Average Price - Dollars / Bushel























# **Barrel Cheddar - CME Average Weekly Price / Pound**















# **Live Cattle - Average Weekly Price USDA - 6 State Average**










































