

Market Commentary


Commentary: What a difference a week makes. Last week farmers were able to make up a lot of lost time regarding planting of corn acres. While they are still not anywhere complete, they did get close to average. In fact record weekly corn plantings were reported and brought corn sowing to within 8% of the 5-yr average. So, corn futures were down. Corn is not out of the woods yet. there are still many acres to go and the rainy weather later in the week caused planting to slow. Soybean futures were up last week. You have probably guessed that planting is still behind for beans, which it is, and there is a long way to go. Traders, as a result, are fearing crop reductions in the near future for beans. In Argentina their AG Ministry cut production of their beans by almost 3% while increasing their exports forecast. This also had a bullish affect on the bean futures. Shifting attention will happen to more new crop vs. old crop. New crop meaning the harvest this coming fall. Volatility is increasing for the soybean complex, but it is clear we are still range locked.

Corn futures closed between \$6.40 and \$6.62 per bushel, ending the week at \$6.57-1/4. Soybean futures closed between \$14.64 and \$14.99-1/2 per bushel, ending the week at \$14.76-1/4. Soybean meal futures closed between \$428.20 and \$440.00 per short ton, ending the week at \$428.20. Soybean oil futures closed between \$0.4920 and \$0.4966 per pound, ending the week at \$0.4924. Wheat futures closed between \$6.80-1/2 and \$7.03-1/4 per bushel, ending the week at \$6.97-1/2.









Soybeans - CBOT Weekly Average Price - Dollars / Bushel
























Barrel Cheddar - CME Average Weekly Price / Pound




40 LB Block Cheddar - CME Average Weekly Price / Pound










Live Cattle - Average Weekly Price USDA - 6 State Average




USDA Coarse ground 81% Steer & Heifer Source




















Crude Oil - Average Weekly Price - NYMEX




Heating Oil - Average Weekly Spot Price - NY Harbour







Gasoline Unleaded - Average Weekly Highway Price




