

Market Commentary


Commentary: Corn futures have hit a 35 month low. That pretty much sums up the agricultural commodities situation. On Friday most AG commodities ended the week on their lows. The markets just can't get the steam to push higher. Funds are still net sellers, and the nearby fundamental do not support a run up. However, with prices being so low, many commercial traders will be covering their physical grain needs. While there is still a bit of confusion as to the direction of the markets at this point, we are way lower than most would expect, and traders are watching the weather, which could potentially spell trouble in the near future. In the Midwest, weather is cooler than expected and that is not good for soybean pod filling and not good for yield. Also the late planted crops, which you know many were, are always concerning as maturity is pushed further out, and frost can really decimate yield. But with the cooler weather and late planted crops, many traders are getting nervous about yield, and I think will soon start putting on some coverage. Any yield issues, and the market will find a direction... up.

Corn futures closed between \$4.65-3/4 and \$4.73-1/2 per bushel, ending the week at \$4.65-3/4. Soybean futures closed between \$13.24-1/4 and \$13.55-3/4 per bushel, ending the week at \$13.40-3/4. Soybean meal futures closed between \$396.00 and \$422.50 per short ton, ending the week at \$420.50. Soybean oil futures closed between \$0.4140 and \$0.4272 per pound, ending the week at \$0.4140. Wheat futures closed between \$6.33-1/2 and \$6.50-1/2 per bushel, ending the week at \$6.33-1/2.










Soybeans - CBOT Weekly Average Price - Dollars / Bushel
























Barrel Cheddar - CME Average Weekly Price / Pound




40 LB Block Cheddar - CME Average Weekly Price / Pound









Live Cattle - Average Weekly Price USDA - 6 State Average




USDA Coarse ground 81% Steer & Heifer Source

























Crude Oil - Average Weekly Price - NYMEX




Heating Oil - Average Weekly Spot Price - NY Harbour









Gasoline Unleaded - Average Weekly Highway Price




