NATIONAL BROILER MARKET AT-A-GLANCE

Whole broiler/fryer prices are trending steady to firm in the East, steady elsewhere. Offerings cover the full range, mostly light to heavy with smaller sizes in the best position. Preliminary majority prices are unchanged when compared to early week prices. Retail and food service demand is light to instances good. Floor stocks are balanced. Market activity is moderate. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week business. Prices for wings are trending firm to higher; steady to firm for tenders and boneless skinless breast. Other items are at least steady. Supplies of wings are light and clearing well; all other parts are light to moderate. Market activity is mostly moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate at mixed, but mostly desirable weights.

MIDWEST BROILER/FRYER Preliminary majority prices were unchanged into Chicago and TFEWR elsewhere. Whole bird prices trended steady with additional offers light to moderate. Retail and food service demand was light to instances good. Floor stocks were balanced. Sizes were mixed. Whole bird market activity was light to moderate. Parts supplies were light to moderate with wings in the tightest position. Prices trended firm to higher on wings, steady to firm on boneless breasts, and steady on the balance of parts. Parts market activity was light to moderate with wings continuing to receive most buyer interest. **NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER** Prices are trending steady to firm for most sizes. Trucklot buying activity for ready-to-cook whole broiler fryers improved slightly and was noted as moderate overall. Offerings of all sizes are sufficient for current needs. Trade activity is moderate. In the parts complex, offerings of wings and breast items are light and clearing well; tenders and dark meat cuts light to moderate for current needs.

SOUTHERN BROILER/FRYER Whole broiler/fryer prices are holding steady. Offerings are moderate to satisfy trade needs. Demand entering the weekend is moderate. Market activity is moderate. In the parts structure, movement is light to moderate for late week trading. Prices for wings continue to trend firm to higher and held with confidence. Breast items are firm with boneless skinless in the strongest position. Tenders are trending steady to firm and dark meat items are mostly steady. Offerings of wings are light, boneless skinless breast are light to moderate and all remaining parts are mostly moderate. Market activity is moderate. In production areas, live supplies are moderate. Weights are mixed, but mostly desirable.

WESTERN BROILER/FRYER The Los Angeles preliminary majority is 99 cents, unchanged from last week. The market on whole fryers is steady. The WOG market is most steady. Some industry members are finding strength on under 3 lb. sized WOGS while others find weakness reported on over 3 lb. weights. Offerings light to moderate. Retail demand light to good, mostly light to moderate. Foodservice demand light to moderate. Floor stocks mostly moderate. Weights desirable. The market on wings and boneless skinless breasts is firm with prices higher, tenderloins and leg meat is steady to firm with prices unchanged to higher, balance of items mostly steady. Domestic demand on boneless skinless breasts and wings moderate to good, balance of items light to

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYERS Less-than-trucklot asking prices are unchanged at 79 to 85 cents with a steady trending undertone. Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds is light to moderate entering the weekend. Offerings are light to instances heavy with the smaller sizes in the best position. Live supplies are moderate; weights are mixed, but noted as mostly desirable. Processor schedules are heavy when combined with some plants operating on Saturday. Market activity is moderate. In the parts complex, offerings of wings are very light. The balance of items ranged light to moderate.
