

Market Commentary


Commentary: The USDA is back online fully and reports are flowing. Harvest is coming toward an end and the USDA is reporting on this. There still seems to be no real new news that might increase volatility so far. However, this week there are a lot of reports coming out from the USDA. The World Agricultural Supply and Demand report is out on Monday and all other regular weekly reports will come out. I still don't foresee any wild swings as a result of this report. Also, keeping volatility out of the market is fund money. They are largely still sitting on the sidelines. With the U.S. crop harvest nearing its end, it is time to pay attention to South American planting and the actual yields from our harvest. We need to keep an ear open toward Chinese demand too. One report that is missing from the government is the EPA report on biofuels. We are not yet sure what they intend to do with the RFS mandate. One area of demand right now is that domestic producers of biofuels are producing large amounts of both biodiesel and ethanol to capture available tax credits. If they stop producing AG prices are likely to come down as demand will be lost. Expect choppy trading this week.

Corn futures closed between \$4.28-1/4 and \$4.32 per bushel, ending the week at \$4.28-1/4. Soybean futures closed between \$12.71-1/4 and \$13.00 per bushel, ending the week at \$12.80-1/4. Soybean meal futures closed between \$403.60 and \$423.50 per short ton, ending the week at \$403.60. Soybean oil futures closed between \$0.4036 and \$0.4162 per pound, ending the week at \$0.4133. Wheat futures closed between \$6.67-1/2 and \$6.90-3/4 per bushel, ending the week at \$6.67-1/2.









Soybeans - CBOT Weekly Average Price - Dollars / Bushel






























