

Lower feed corn prices this year will benefit large turkey producers next year when the flocks will start feeding off lower priced feed. Tyson Foods alone expects its feed costs to fall some \$500 million over the coming fiscal year. Feed costs make up about 70% of a turkey's cost, notes *The Wall Street Journal*. Soybean growers may have high-oleic varieties available for planting in 2017, according to a Minnesota soybean breeder. High-oleic soybean oil would be free of artificial trans fat, which FDA is proposing to ban in the U.S. food supply.
