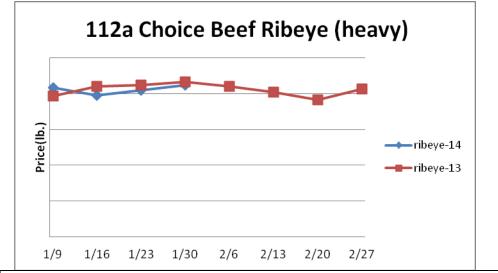
Beef, Veal and Lamb Report

Beef, Veal & Lamb Beef production last week rose .4% but was 4.4% less than the same week a year ago. Beef output is expected to trend below 2013 levels in the coming months last affirmed by last week's USDA cattle on feed report. According to the USDA, the January 1 cattle on feed inventory was 5.4% less than the prior year and the smallest for the date since 1997. The USDA is forecasting beef output this winter to track 5.5% below last year. The beef end cut markets continue to trade near record high levels. Retailers are reported to be rethinking beef feature plans for the coming months which could lead to lower beef prices shortly. Last February, the choice 168 inside round market fell 8.5%. Price USDA, FOB per pound.



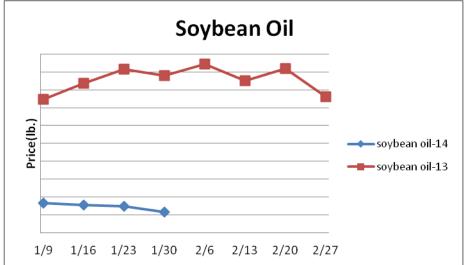

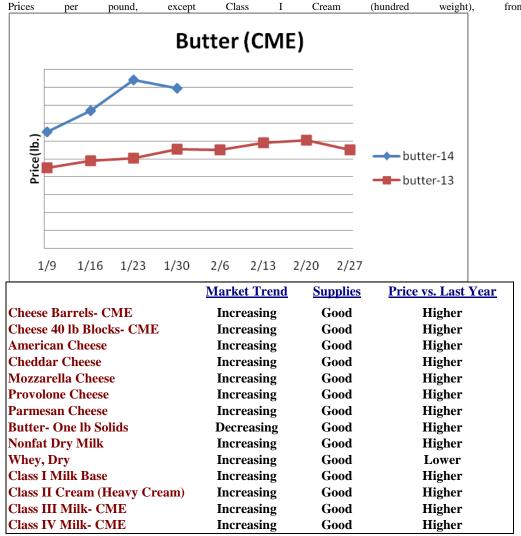

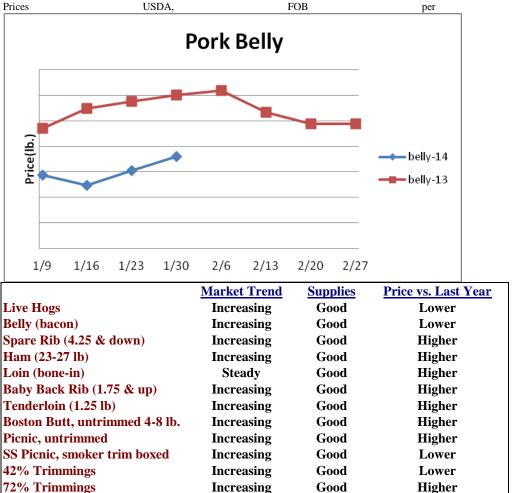
Dairy Report

Dairy - The weather continues to negatively impact milk production. U.S. milk output during December was .1% less than the prior year due to a .1% smaller milk cow herd and flat milk per cow yields. Milk farmers did add a net 2,000 head to the herd during the month which marks the first monthly build since July. Record high margins are expected to lead to further milk cow herd and milk production expansion in the coming months which eventually could weigh on the dairy markets. The CME cheese markets set new record highs this week. The butter market has softened. Prices per pound, except Class I Cream (hundred weight), from USDA



Pork Report

Pork- Pork output last week declined 1.5% but was a whopping 7.1% greater than the same week a year ago. Hog weights have been trending 3% heavier than last year which is contributing to the year over year gains in production. Still, PEDv could make pork output challenging at times this winter. The pork markets may be forming a bottom. Typically pork prices are relatively flat during February. December 31 pork belly stocks were 124% bigger than 2012. Prices USDA, FOB per pound.



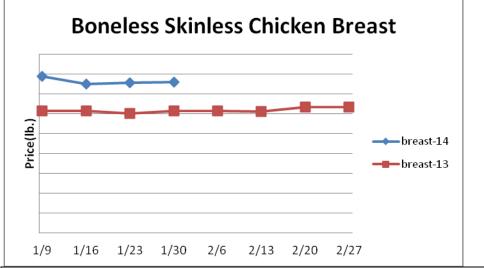
Canned Tomato Report

Poultry Report

Poultry- - Chicken output for the week ending January 18th declined 2.9% but was 6.1% larger than the same week a year ago. Strong chicken production gains are anticipated to persist which may continue to weigh on the chicken markets. The ARA daily chicken wing index has risen 9% since the beginning of the year due to better demand for the football playoff season. However, modestly lower chicken wing prices are almost certainly on the horizon. The five year average move for the ARA chicken wing index during February is down 12.5%. The chicken breast markets are usually fairly flat next month before jumping higher in March. December 31 chicken breast stocks were 16% less than the previous year while chicken wing (29%) and leg quarter (34%) holdings were larger than 2012. Prices USDA, FOB pound per except when noted.



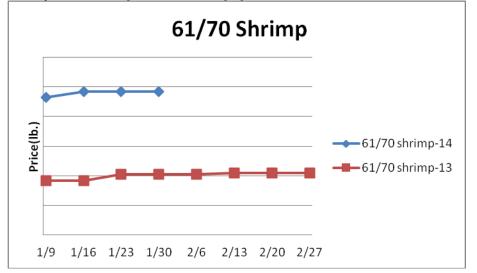

Seafood Snow crab leg prices remain relatively inflated. The U.S. Bering Sea snow crab fishing season is progressing with 35% of the quota landed to date. However, the 2013-14 Bering sea snow crab quota is down 18.6% from the previous season and the smallest in four years. Fairly firm snow crab leg prices are expected to endure in February. 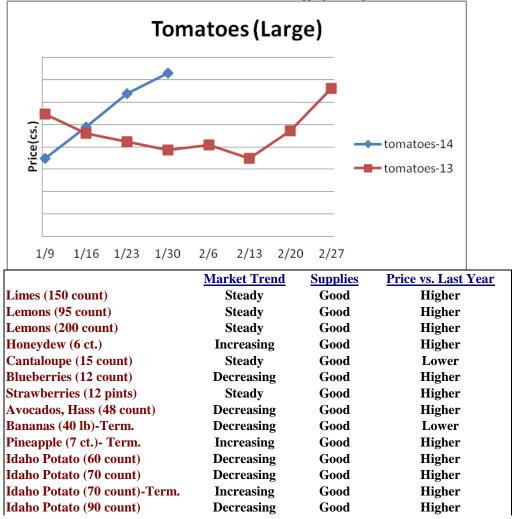

Produce Report

Produce- Periods of cold weather in Florida has negatively impacted the tomato crops. Tomato shipments from the state last week declined 20.6% and were 22.5% less than the same week a year ago. Solid imports from Mexico have helped alleviate the impact on the tomato markets. Still, tomato prices could be relatively firm in the near term. The lettuce markets continue to trend at engaging price levels for buyers with the cold winter dampening demand. The downside price risk in lettuce from here is almost certainly minimal.
