


Market Commentary

Commentary: Last week was interesting in the commodity markets. It seems traders are starting to react to drought concerns around the world and taking particular notice of the problems in California. With regards to corn, wheat, beans, meal, and soybean oil, there really is not much concern of futures being affected by CA's drought, but traders are using this as an excuse to run prices up a bit, trading on emotion. It is possible that prices can be affected by feed changes in California since grazing opportunities are dramatically limited. Coming up at the end of March the USDA will report on planting intentions. Leading up to this report, there will be a lot of speculation, but we could see some movement to the downside if what we believe is true, that farmers are moving acres over to soybeans. Soybean profitability is higher, the balance sheet is weaker, corn prices are way down over last year and farmers do need to rotate their crops. With South America lagging behind expected, and the U.S. probably planting a lot more beans, what does this mean? We could see neutral movement in the market, but no one makes any money when markets are static.










Soybeans - CBOT Weekly Average Price - Dollars / Bushel




































Live Cattle - Average Weekly Price USDA - 6 State Average













































