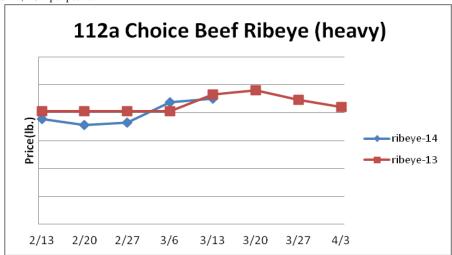
#### Beef, Veal and Lamb Report

**Beef, Veal & Lamb** Beef production last week declined 4.2% and was 7.5% less than the same week a year ago. Tight cattle supplies and herd rebuilding by beef and dairy farmers are anticipated to limit cattle and cow slaughter for the next several months. Strong ground beef demand is pressuring the grind and beef trim markets upward. Beef trim shipments last week, however, were some of their smallest for any non-holiday week in the last ten years. This suggests that a top may be near in the beef trim markets. Typically, however, the 90 percent and 50 percent domestic beef trim markets don't peak until May. Beef strips and top butts usually remain firm deep into the spring as well. Price USDA, FOB per pound.

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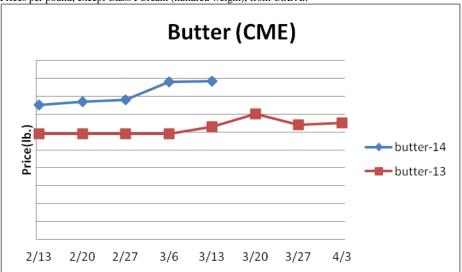
# **Canned Tomato Report**

## **Dairy Report**

**Dairy** The cheese markets continue to trade at historically inflated levels. Cheese exports during January were 46% larger than the previous year and were a record. However, the rising domestic cheese prices are tempering existing cheese exports. Further, milk production is beginning to seasonally build. The downside price risk in the cheese markets from here is much greater than the upside. Butter exports during January were 136% bigger than 2013 and the fourth largest for any month on record. Solid butter exports may be supportive of butter prices through the spring. Prices per pound, except Class I Cream (hundred weight), from USDA..

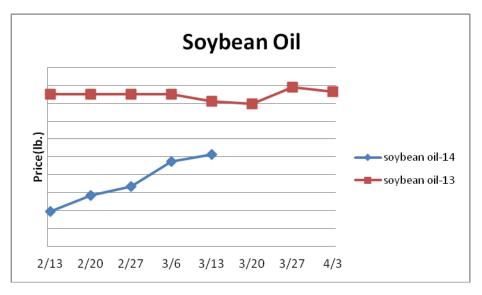

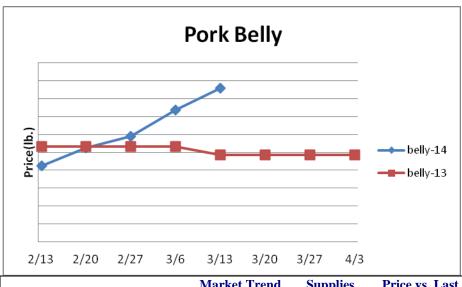

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## **Pork Report**

**Pork** - Pork production last week declined 3.8% and was 3.3% less than a year ago. Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea virus (PEDv) is limiting the existing hog supply. This may continue through the spring although heavier hog weights should temper some of the impact on overall pork output. The USDA is projecting Q2 pork production to be .2% larger than last year but private sources are indicating that output may even be less. Firm pork prices could persist. Prices USDA, FOB per pound.

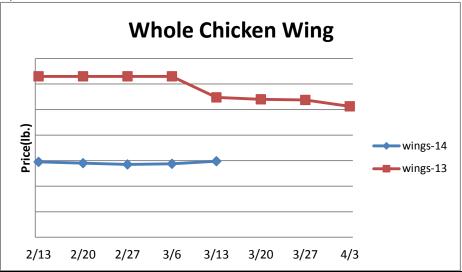

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#### **Poultry Report**

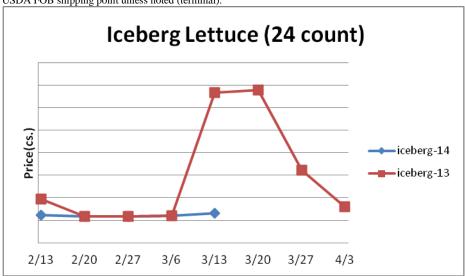
**Poultry**-Chicken output for the week ending March 1 declined 1.9% but was 2.9% larger than last year. Disappointing winter margins for chicken producers have propelled them to slow output expansion. The six week moving average for chick placements is tracking .1% below last year suggesting much more disciplined chicken production growth this spring. This factor and inflated alternative protein prices including beef and pork appear to be starting to drive the chicken breast markets upward. The ARA daily Boneless Skinless Chicken Breast Index has risen 8.8% in the last week and further price increases are likely. Usually the boneless skinless chicken breast markets appreciate near 13% from now until peaking in mid-May. Higher dark meat chicken prices are anticipated in the coming weeks as well. # **Produce Report**

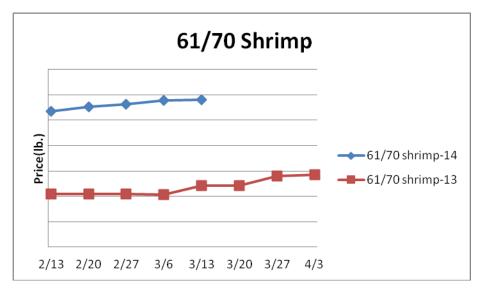
**Produce-** The avocado market remains firm. Adverse weather in California is expected to shorten the avocado harvest in the coming months which is anticipated to underpin avocado prices. Avocado case prices in the \$50's are likely later this year. The five year average move for the avocado market during the next fifteen weeks is an increase of 19%. Lettuce supplies remain adequate with historically low prices persevering. However, better lettuce demand is likely to occur in the coming weeks as the weather warms which could bring a modest lift to the lettuce markets. **Seafood** - U.S. shrimp imports during January were 4.2% larger than the previous year however, disease challenges in Thailand, the world's largest shrimp exporter, continue to limit the overall supply. U.S. shrimp imports from Thailand during the month were down 43% from 2013 and the least for any month since July. Inflated shrimp prices may persist this spring.
