


Market Commentary

Commentary: China is ordering heavy from the U.S. Technically, we don't have enough beans to fulfill their orders and our own demand. In fact we are seeing soybean prices increase as a result of such tight bean supplies. With planting intensions released, futures prices may continue to climb, but I maintain they will stay within a range without going to the moon. On another front, though, crude oil prices are still hovering around \$100.00 per barrel. Gas, diesel, and heating oil prices are up. This does tend to move soybean oil and most commodities higher. Specifically to soybean oil, crushers are crushing less beans currently and exporting millions of bushels of beans. This will draw down soybean oil stocks and tighten basis. You may see short-term lower oil prices at the futures level, but see cash prices run steady to higher. The Canola situation seems to be getting worse. Manufacturers in the U.S. are still having trouble getting Canola. The rail cars are in short supply causing shortages of Canola in the U.S. On the good news front, peanut oil has trended way down this year. If you were to compare peanut oil now against soybean oil, the gap between them is tighter than ever.









Soybeans - CBOT Weekly Average Price - Dollars / Bushel


































































Foreign Exchange Rate - Euro, EMU Members
