BEEF COMMENTARY

Negative pressure on the Round Primal section of the carcass forced total carcass cutouts lower. Yellow Sheet's Choice Carcass Value moved \$2.58 lower; the Yellow Sheet Select Carcass Value slipped lower by \$6.20. Buyer's interest remained fair at best heading into the Labor Day Holiday weekend, as they maintained a conservative approach with spot market procurement. Ground beef values were largely unchanged during the week.

LIVE CATTLE: Cattle trading developed late in the week. Sales of the live animal and the dressed carcass advanced from week prior levels. The live animal sold at \$155/cwt in the South. Northern sale barns were lightly tested at the \$155/cwt mark. The dressed carcass traded ownership at \$243/cwt to \$248/cwt, very light volume as of this report. Last week's live market was spread between \$152/cwt to \$155/cwt; the dressed carcass sold last week at \$240/cwt to \$243/cwt.

SLAUGHTER & BEEF PRODUCTION: The weekly F.I. Slaughter was 584,000 head, 6,000 head below last week's tally. The same week in 2013 saw 633,000 head processed under federal inspection. Live cattle weights now estimated at 1330 pounds, up 4 pounds from week priors report. Dressed carcass weights were 3 pound higher from last week's estimated weights, now listed at 813 pounds.

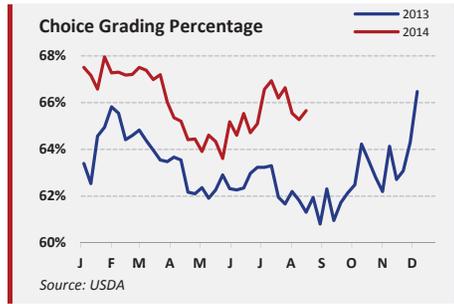
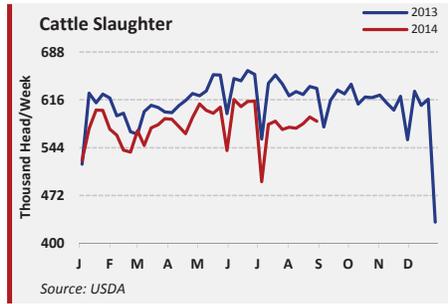
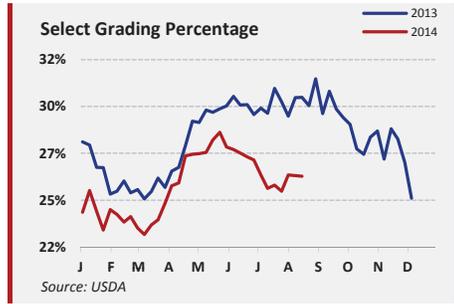
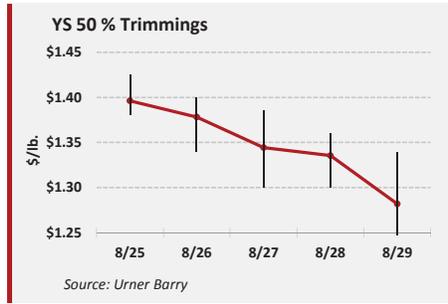
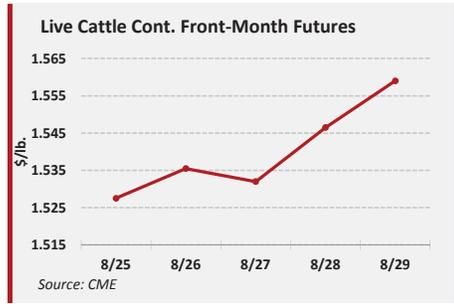
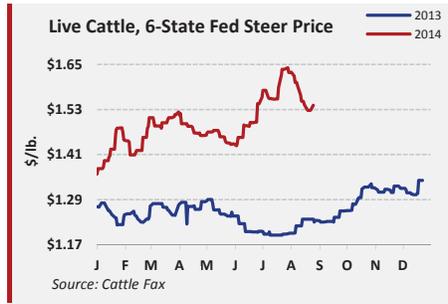
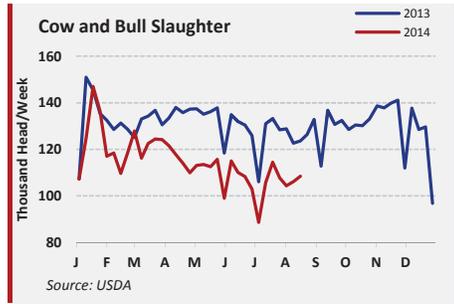
RIBS: Choice ribs found higher trading ranges; while select and no-roll ribs continued to see some minor discounting to sell spot product.

CHUCKS: Choice and select Chuck cutouts found stability as chuck rolls and clods traded ownership at levels above week prior. Export demand lent support to the firming of values.

ROUNDS: Rounds saw discounting applied to spot market product. Insides posed a challenge to beef processors; packers looked to clear their coolers ahead of the holiday weekend which prompted sharp price reductions.

LOINS: Peeled tenderloins have realized higher trading ranges. Select strips and short loins struggled for steady.

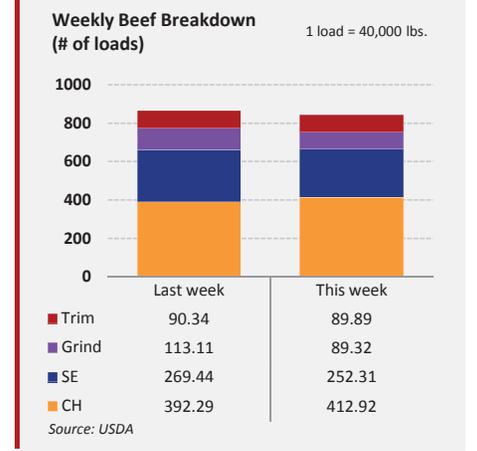
BONELESS BEEF: Fresh 50s trended lower each day this week. Weakness in that market was largely attributed to product being more readily available. This week's cattle slaughter was estimated at 584,000 head. Fresh 90s moved higher as the week progressed. Buying interest was reportedly more active.



YS BEEF CUTOOUT-CH/SE SPREAD (\$/cwt)

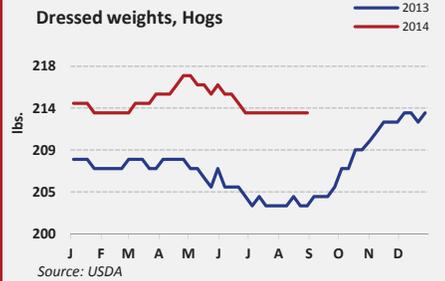

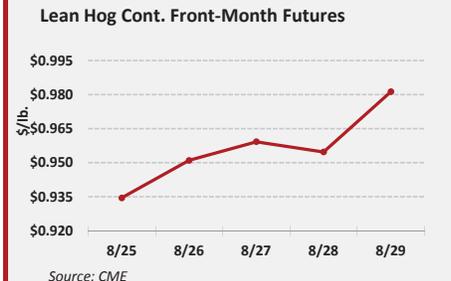

PORK COMMENTARY

Margins were maintained this week as wholesale values slowed their decline. In the bellwether lowa-southern Minnesota area, the weighted average of carcass base hogs fell roughly 5 percent. At the same time, Urner Barry's pork carcass cutout lost 3.1 percent, going from \$101.474/cwt last Friday to \$98.295/cwt this Friday. The Urner Barry pork packer margin index ranged between \$8.04 and \$13.55/head.

PORK PRODUCTION: Total pork production for the week ending Aug 30, 2014 was estimated at 421.3 million lbs. This total was .6 percent below last week and 5.9 percent below the same week a year ago. Average hog weights, at 284 pounds, were even with last week and 13 pounds over last year.

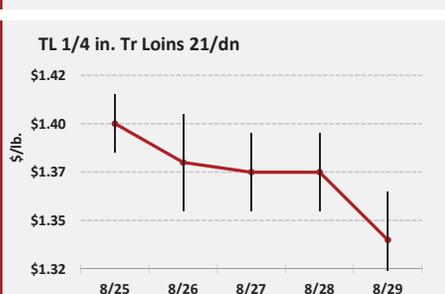
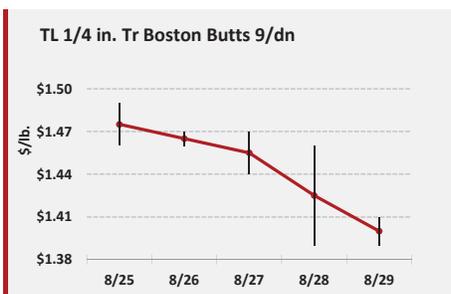
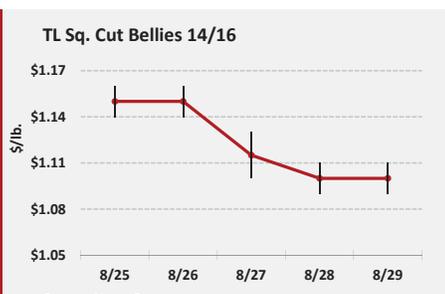
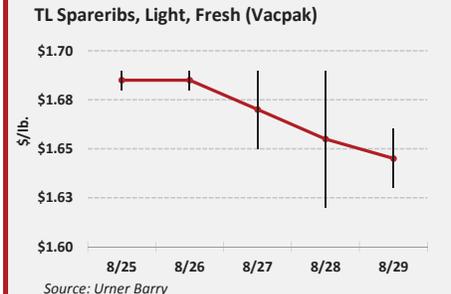
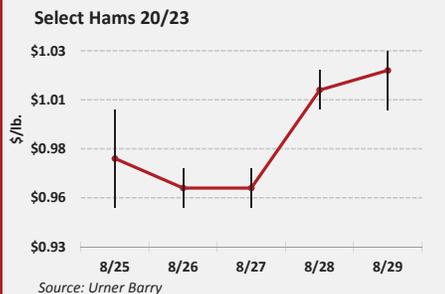
HAMS: Bone-in hams had their first up-week since July this week on renewed interest from Mexican and domestic buyers. With summer coming to an end, demand for roasts typically starts emerging shortly after Labor Day. By Friday, 20 to 23lb hams gained 1 percent or \$1/cwt while 23 to 27lb hams appreciated by 2.1 percent or \$2.00/cwt.

BELLIES: The combination of ample fresh and frozen product continued to weigh on the belly market this week. Buyers have yet to take advantage of the steep price declines seen recently. 12 through 20lb skin-on bellies fell between 5.9 and 12.7 percent or \$7.00 to \$15.00/cwt by Friday.

TRIMMINGS: Trimmings declined this week as sellers attempted to balance their inventories ahead of the long weekend. 42's fell 7 percent or \$3.00/cwt. 72's were more abundant and ended the week 9 percent or \$9.00/cwt lower. Boneless picnics declined by 6.1 percent.

RETAIL: We continued to detect weakness in most all categories of fresh pork this week; however the loin component appears to have come into better balance, despite isolated instances of discounting. Renewed interest from the retail sector, particularly in loins, appears to be somewhat price supportive. Still, many of this week's comparisons will show declines. Bone-in loin values fell another \$5.00 to \$6.00/cwt, while bone-in centers proved to be a mixed-bag, and boneless loins actually showed signs of improvement, up \$2.00 to \$12.00/cwt. Tenderloins held, while sirloins proved to be weak. Picnics declined \$10.00 to \$12.00/cwt, and butts \$8.00 to \$11.00/cwt. These items proved most vulnerable amid generally widespread availability. Rib items ranged steady to weaker.

Lamb carcasses settled at mostly steady price levels. Boxed cuts were generally steady with several participants noting that movement was a little better this week.

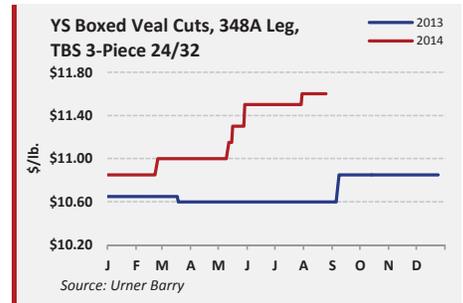
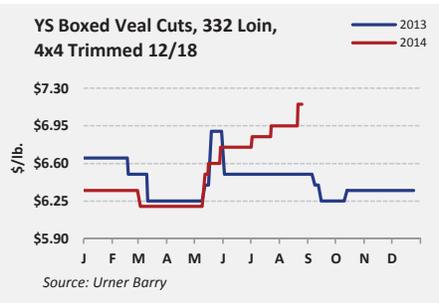
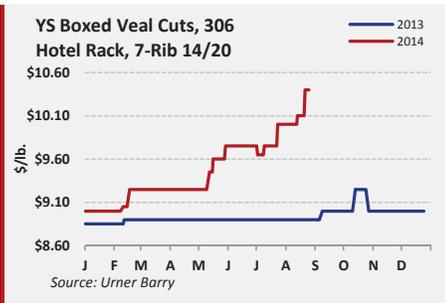

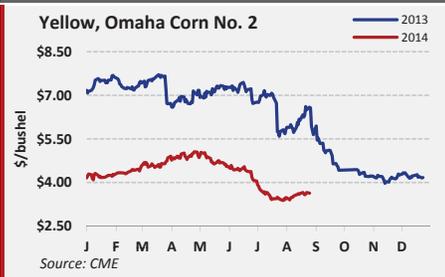


VEAL COMMENTARY

FEEDS: CORN, SOY BEAN, RED WHEAT



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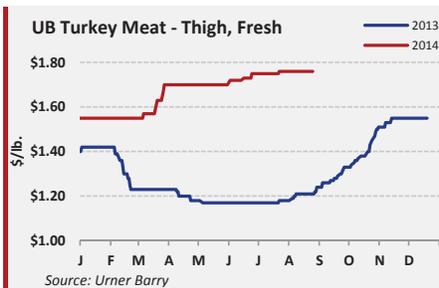
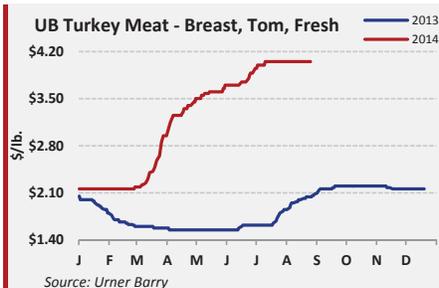
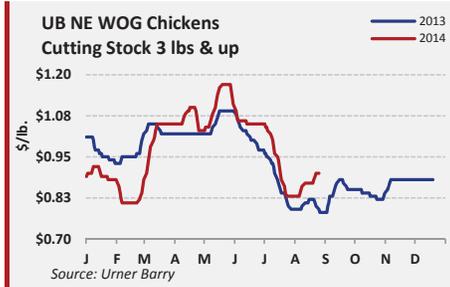
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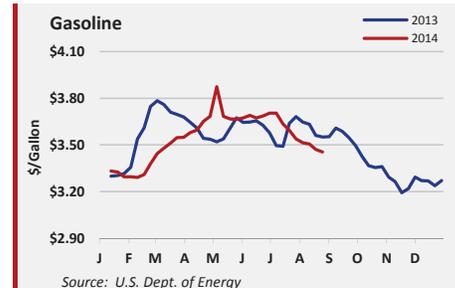
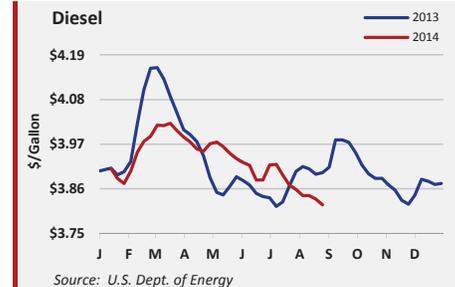

POULTRY COMMENTARY

There are a few developments starting to take shape in the chicken complex, but observers will have to wait until after the holiday weekend before a clear picture finally presents itself. All week, cutting stock WOGs were barely adequate to short at most points of sale. Jumbo wing values advanced periodically as they too were in a similarly snug position. Buyers at all levels have become aggressive in pursuing wings as football season kicks off. Tenders, on the other hand, have begun to soften significantly. Supplies weren't necessarily burdensome all week, but buyers are standing firmly behind their discounted bids. According to multiple sources, boneless breasts have remained the steadiest of items on our sheet. The range of reported values is the tightest it's been in weeks. As for the back half of the bird, no item is rated better than about steady and all items are still being kept under a close watch. Reports are that drumsticks and thighs are still experiencing some pressure. Leg quarters have been trading all over the board, with smaller sized product receiving the best money. Leg meat and thigh meat have improved their positions, but trading levels are still only fair at best. MSC,

especially frozen, is testing.

The last few days have been characterized by scattered input generated by only the most immediate needs which proved to be few and far between. The most actively traded lines during the week have been parts with necks picking up the pace considerably towards week's end. Steady to higher prices is the rule for each of the major parts lines with the exception of hen necks. Drums are in excellent shape with further premiums asked and paid for China approved product. Whole body turkeys close the week in a stronger position than at its outset. The amount of hens or toms being offered has been oscillating recently. At times there are fewer toms than hens being shown while on other occasions the trend is reversed. For now, both lines are very well supported with forward sales taking place in a varying range of premiums. Frozen thigh meat is testing. Offerings are adequate, some of them discounted but they are not broadly based. Fresh is increasingly being consumed internally. Breast meat demand is irregular at best and that was pretty much the case for the balance of raw materials which close the week very well supported.
