

#### **Market Commentary**


Commentary: I am sure I have sounded like a broken record over the last several weeks about soybean oil achieving new contract lows, but this past week something was different. Corn, beans, meal, and wheat all reached contract lows, but soybean oil jumped back. Perhaps traders believe the bottom was reached and started to buy oil. While many have been trying to find the bottom of the futures market, the real opportunity is/was basis. Basis should have been contracted weeks or even months ago. Spot basis will have you crying the blues if you have no basis coverage. Now we see futures coming back a bit, and higher basis than I have seen. Why the high basis numbers? Bean oil is extremely tight. Beans are tight and so is meal. The cash value of soybean meal remains higher than this time last year in spot of the much lower futures numbers. So, the soybean complex markets are inverted (table below), meaning the value right now is worth more than in the future which is backwards. Also note the cash price vs. the futures prices. This should rectify itself very quickly as harvest comes in. In a few weeks, harvest will be fully under way. As far as Canola is concerned it is still not known the full impact of their snow a couple weeks back. They still have a lot of Canola to sell though, from the last harvest. The problem is that their currency is weaker vs. the U.S. dollar and Canola reached a new contract low. Farmers my not want to sell. In addition, there still is a transportation issue with rail cars which is starting to put a lot of strain on trucking too. We have talked to many people regarding the rail car issue and it could last a couple more years until it is worked out.









## Soybeans - CBOT Weekly Average Price - Dollars / Bushel





























