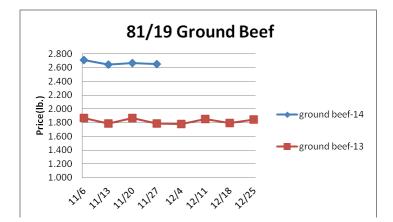
Weekly Market Updates

Beef- Beef production last week rose 1.4% but was 6.3% less than the same week a year ago. Cattle supplies are expected to remain limited this winter. The November 1 cattle on feed inventory was .1% larger than 2013 while cattle placements into feedlots during October were down .9%. The December 1 near slaughter ready cattle herd is projected to be 3.3% less than the three year average for the date. Despite better interest for holiday beef items, overall beef demand has been tempered by record retail prices. Total beef shipments last week were the smallest for any non-holiday week since April. Elevated retail beef prices may temper any wholesale beef market inflation this winter. Price USDA, FOB per pound.

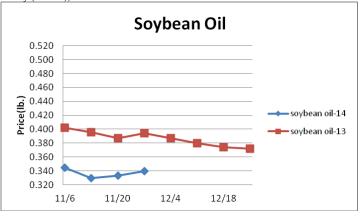

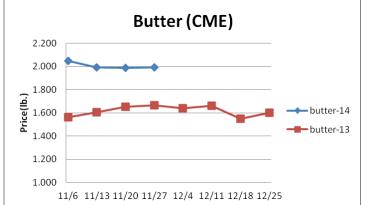

Dairy- U.S. milk production during October was 3.8% more than the prior year due to a .8% larger milk cow herd and a 2.9% gain in milk per cow yields. Milk farmers added a net 4,000 head to the herd during the month with the total inventory the largest since April 2009. Favorable margins for milk farmers is expected to cause solid milk output growth versus 2014 this winter which could weigh on dairy prices. The cheese markets have fallen sharply as of late. The butter market has remained resilient but lower butter prices are anticipated in the coming weeks. Prices per pound, except Class I Cream (hundred weight), from USDA.

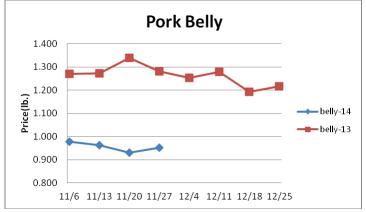

Pork- Pork output last week rose .7% but was 3.7% less than the same week last year. PEDv cases in the hog herd are anticipated to escalate in the coming months due to colder temperatures. But farmers have more tools and information to combat the disease this year which should temper the impact on pork supplies. The USDA anticipates pork production to start trending above year ago levels on a regular basis this winter. Pork bellies have continued to trade at attractive levels for buyers but the belly markets could find support soon. Prices USDA, FOB per pound.

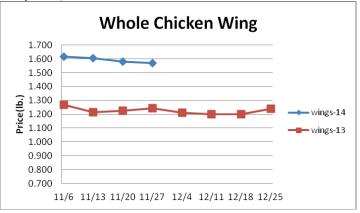

Poultry- Chicken production for the week ending November 15th fell 1.3% from the prior week but was 6.4% larger than the same week a year ago. Better chicken supplies and heavy bird weights are expected to cause chicken output to track above the prior year levels in the coming months. The USDA is forecasting winter chicken production to track 2.9% above 2014. The chicken wing markets have remained weak as of late. The ARA Boneless Skinless Chicken Breast Index recently declined to an eight month low. Typically the chicken breast markets are fairly flat from now through the end of the year but there may be more downside risk to prices this fall. Prices USDA. FOB per pound except when noted

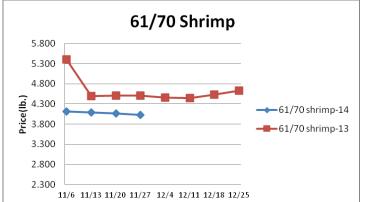

Seafood- Domestic shrimp output was better during October with U.S. Gulf of Mexico shrimp landings up 26% compared to the prior year. However, year to date Gulf of Mexico shrimp landings are the smallest since 2010. A favorable currency valuation is anticipated to encourage U.S. shrimp imports this winter which may weigh on shrimp prices. 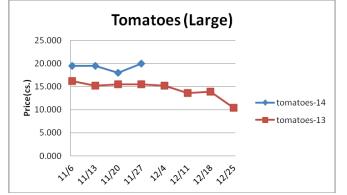

Produce- Lettuce supplies are improving with the production shift to the Yuma-Imperial Valley region. Total iceberg lettuce shipments last week rose 19% and were 8% more than the same week a year ago. Relatively favorable weather is forecasted for the lettuce crops during the next few weeks which should aid the harvest. Modestly lower lettuce prices may be forthcoming. Avocado prices have weakened during this month but history suggests that the downside risk in the avocado markets from here is likely nominal. Prices USDA FOB shipping point unless noted (terminal).
