

Market Commentary


Commentary: The soybean oil market tried to break 30 cents following the release of planting intentions from the USDA but was unable to do so and by week's end bounced back to end the week at 31.04 cents. Usually, and in this case, traders anticipate the release of USDA reports and most report related trading has already been accounted for in the futures price. This is the case for corn, wheat and the soybean complex. As for planting intentions released by the USDA, soybean acres came in at 84.6 million acres which is about 1.3 million less than expected. Corn acres were higher than thought, but that did not cause too much action for trading either but corn prices did come down a little last week. We really need to keep an eye on weather as some very dry conditions are presenting themselves in the growing regions.

Canola oil is not experiencing too many logistics issues, but prices are still high as crush margins are unfavorable for manufacturers. Corn oil has flattened as it recently saw some increases. Peanut has done nothing and is very stable.









Soybeans - CBOT Weekly Average Price - Dollars / Bushel




























