



Market Commentary

Commentary: The CME Group is changing back to 200 point daily trading limits from 250 point limits. That does not seem like a lot but consider that each futures contract is 60,000 pounds so the difference is \$300 per contract. The limits are there to protect traders from losing it all in one trading session. It helps keep emotion from taking over. Crude oil does not have limits and you can see how quickly that market can move. many have sought to put trading limits on crude oil, but have not been successful.


So what happened last week you see in the chart above that the U.S. dollar has lost its momentum and has begun sliding downward and crude oil prices have naturally gone higher with the weaker dollar. Exports for beans have been a little stronger than expected and crush margins have improved in the U.S. which will likely keep us above 30 cent soybean oil. U.S planting for soybeans is pretty much on schedule which does not mean much at this time, but corn is showing a slight bit behind. Still not much of an impact as of yet. Those very dry areas in the Northern U.S. have definitely improved. The Dakotas are still a little dry, but nothing to worry about at this time. The extreme West of the U.S. is the only major worry and the drought there will have an impact on dairy and produce. Below is the drought monitor.











Soybeans - CBOT Weekly Average Price - Dollars / Bushel




























40 LB Block Cheddar - CME Average Weekly Price / Pound
