## **Bait and Tackle Retailers Generated \$2.3 Billion in 2013**

A recent NOAA study found that independent marine recreational bait and tackle retail stores provide a big boost to the economy: in 2013, these retailers contributed approximately \$2.3 billion across the broader U.S. economy, including \$796 million in income. Because the sharks' ranges lie entirely outside U.S. jurisdiction, we are not proposing to designate critical habitat.

## **Great Lakes**

### **Severe Harmful Algal Bloom Predicted for Lake Erie**

NOAA and our research partners predict that the 2015 western Lake Erie harmful algal bloom season will be among the most severe in recent years, second only to the record-setting 2011 bloom. The forecast uses models that translate spring nutrient loading into predicted algal blooms in the western basin of the lake.

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## Alaska

### New Way to Protect Harbor Seals in Disenchantment Bay

Tidewater glacial fjords provide important habitat for harbor seals. Over the past several decades, these areas have seen sharp increases in tour ship traffic, which can disturb the seals' activities. ### Skates in the Gulf of Alaska - Open for Public Comment

By **August 10**, please submit your comments on proposed revisions to the maximum retainable amount of skates using groundfish and halibut as a basis species in the Gulf of Alaska. NOAA Fisheries proposes reducing the maximum retainable amount to decrease the incentive to target skates and to slow the catch rate of skates in these fisheries.

### Gulf of Alaska Bycatch - Open for Public Comment

By **August 28**, please submit your comments on a proposed bycatch management program for the Gulf of Alaska trawl groundfish fisheries. NOAA Fisheries and the North Pacific Fishery Management Council are preparing an environmental impact statement for the program and seek information from the public.

### Reward for Information on Slain Steller Sea Lions

On June 1, NOAA Fisheries responded to a report of several dead marine mammals on a beach near Cordova, Alaska, finding several deliberately killed Steller sea lions. NOAA Fisheries' Office of Law Enforcement and Cordova District Fishermen United are offering a combined \$7,500 reward for information leading to a conviction.

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## West Coast

### Newest NOAA Fisheries Survey Vessel to Survey Whales

NOAA's newest research ship, the *Reuben Lasker*, embarked last week on a mission to survey gray whales along the West Coast and search for right whales in the Gulf of Alaska. The ship departed its home port of San Diego on July 9 and is scheduled to arrive in Kodiak, Alaska, on August 1. The *Lasker* is specially engineered to operate more quietly than other ships, minimizing the disturbance to marine life.

### New Reports on Puget Sound Steelhead Status

Two recently published technical memorandums synthesize the

best available science to describe the status of threatened steelhead populations in the Puget Sound region and to establish criteria for population viability and recovery progress. These reports will inform the Puget Sound steelhead recovery plan.

### **Environmental Impacts for Puget Sound Hatchery Plans**

NOAA Fisheries announces our intention to prepare an environmental impact statement for five Hatchery and Genetic Management Plans for early winter steelhead hatchery programs jointly submitted by the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife and tribal co-managers. We seek suggestions and information to inform the scope of the statement, and two public workshops will be held **July 20-21**.

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## **Southeast**

### **Modified Trip Limits for Atlantic Group Spanish Mackerel**

NOAA Fisheries published a final rule to implement Framework Amendment 2 to the Coastal Migratory Pelagic Resources in the Gulf of Mexico and South Atlantic Region fishery management plan. This action will streamline the commercial trip limit system for the Atlantic migratory group of Spanish mackerel.

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## **Greater Atlantic**

### **Who Is Protecting Endangered Atlantic Salmon?**

### **Denial of Petition for Rulemaking for Gulf of Maine Cod**

A Petition for Rulemaking requested that NOAA Fisheries prohibit commercial and recreational fishing for Gulf of Maine cod until the incidental fishing mortality does not exceed the acceptable biological catch limit. After reviewing the petition and considering recent management measures, NOAA Fisheries denied the request.
